Executive Summary

Sector Overview

As of 2025, the Global Government Technology sector (“GovTech”) amounted to \$660b and is projected to reach \$1.0t by 2030, growing at a CAGR of 8.9%.

Q4 2025 GovTech M&A remained strong, with strategic and sponsor-backed acquisitions across public safety, AI, cybersecurity, and municipal platforms. Momentum in mission-critical, compliance-driven assets carried into year-end.

Looking ahead to 2026, U.S. GovTech will move from AI pilots to scaled, mission-driven deployment, supported by hybrid infrastructure and agentic systems.

Q4 2025 Report Themes



Governments are treating AI as sovereign infrastructure, prioritizing jurisdictional control, auditability, and defense-grade vendors.



Security and supply-chain assurance now outweigh features, as CMMC 2.0 and DFARS make compliance mandatory for federal contracts.



Security built around user identity and limited access is key as agencies modernize and face growing AI-related cyber threats.

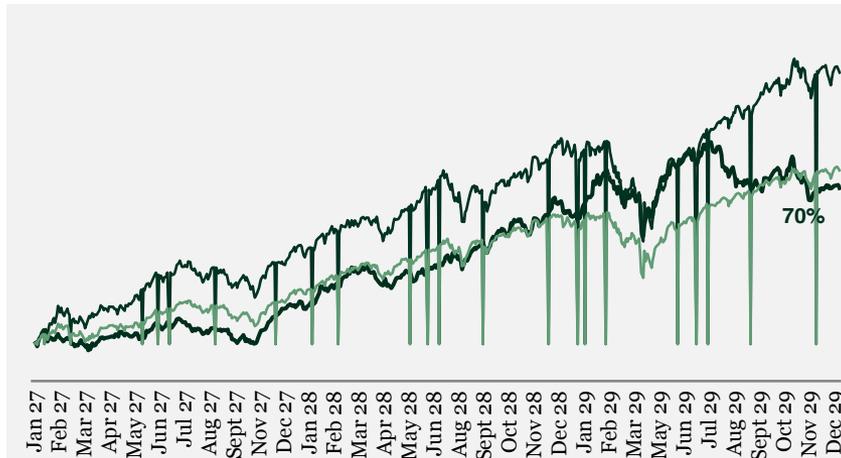


AI risks and global cyber threats are making security a national priority, speeding up adoption of post-quantum encryption.

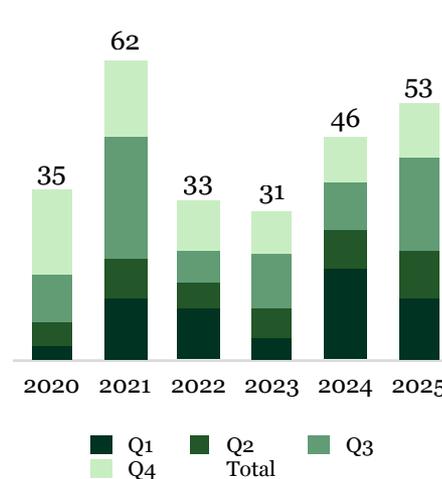


Rising state and local IT spending is driving demand for outsourced security, interoperable data, and resilient cloud infrastructure.

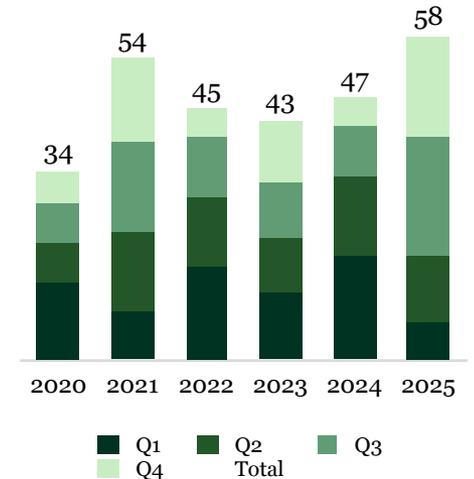
GovTech Companies Performance*

Industry Trends and Outlook (1/2)

Global Government Technology Market Size (\$b)

1 The World Economic Forum reports that government technology could unlock nearly \$10 trillion in public value by 2034, driven by efficiency, transparency, and sustainability through global collaboration and digital modernization.

2 Acting Federal Chief Information Security Officer Michael Duffy highlighted three priorities: stronger enterprise cyber defenses, improved operational resilience, and securing a modern government, with emphasis on interagency coordination, incident readiness, and Zero Trust-based modernization.

3 Launched in December 2025, the U.S. Tech Force recruits about 1,000 technologists into federal agencies for two-year assignments to advance AI and IT modernization, combining agency leadership roles with industry training and collaboration.



2025 Outlook Trends



U.S. Federal AI Procurement Will Shift Toward Sovereign-First Models

AI will be treated as national infrastructure, not just software. Federal buying will prioritize model origin, hosting control, and governance transparency. Vendors unable to prove jurisdictional control risk exclusion.



Agentic AI Risk Will Enter the National Security Domain

Autonomous AI creates geopolitical risks beyond cybersecurity. Misuse could trigger diplomatic or economic fallout. Federal systems will require auditability, containment, and strict oversight.



Defense Vendors Gain Civilian Contracts

Rising security demands are shifting federal procurement toward defense-grade vendors. Civilian agencies now prioritize resilience and mission assurance. More major civilian contracts will go to firms with national security credentials.



Security and Governance Will Outweigh Features

Federal tech decisions are shifting from capability to defensibility. Agencies now prioritize AI governance, hosting control, data security, and risk transparency. Compliance and supply-chain assurance are becoming decisive factors.



Zero Trust Will Remain the Cybersecurity Foundation

Zero Trust continues to anchor federal cybersecurity strategy. Identity-first security and least-privilege access help manage expanding threats. Its role becomes more critical as AI increases system complexity.

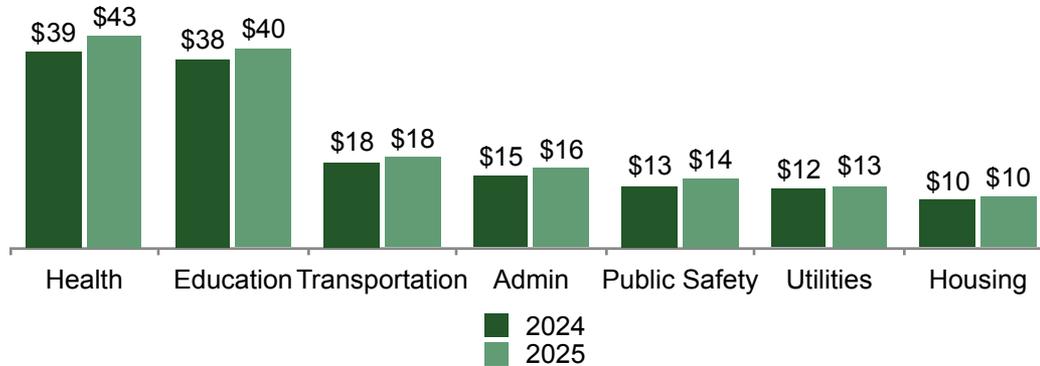


Post-Quantum Cryptography Becomes a Priority

Quantum computing threatens today's encryption standards. Agencies are beginning the shift to post-quantum cryptography to protect sensitive data. Cryptographic resilience is emerging as a national security priority.

Industry Trends and Outlook (2/2)

Projected Government Tech Spending (\$b)



- Spending is expected to rise across all verticals in 2025, with the most rapid growth projected in administration and public safety.
- Total state and local government IT spending is forecasted to exceed \$154 billion, reflecting a 6.4% increase over 2024. Of this, approximately \$78 billion is projected to come from states, while \$75 billion is expected to be driven by city and county governments.

CMMC 2.0 Becomes a Binding Requirement for Defense Contractors



The Department of Defense has finalized implementation of the Cybersecurity Maturity Model Certification (CMMC) 2.0 program.

Cybersecurity requirements have shifted from policy guidance to enforceable contract conditions.

Under the updated DFARS rule, CMMC clauses are now being incorporated into DoD solicitations and contracts.

Contractors and subcontractors handling Federal Contract Information (FCI) or Controlled Unclassified Information (CUI) must maintain the required CMMC compliance level.

Compliance status is becoming a prerequisite for eligibility to win and perform defense contracts.

Impact on the GovTech Market



Contractors must invest in identity security, endpoint protection, monitoring, and secure cloud environments to meet control requirements.

Small and mid-tier suppliers lacking in-house security capabilities are increasingly turning to managed security service providers (MSSPs) and compliance advisors.

Prime contractors are pushing cybersecurity requirements down the supply chain, expanding market opportunity beyond direct DoD vendors.

Compliance status is becoming a competitive differentiator in defense procurements, not just a regulatory hurdle.

Q4 25 Government Technology Companies Performance

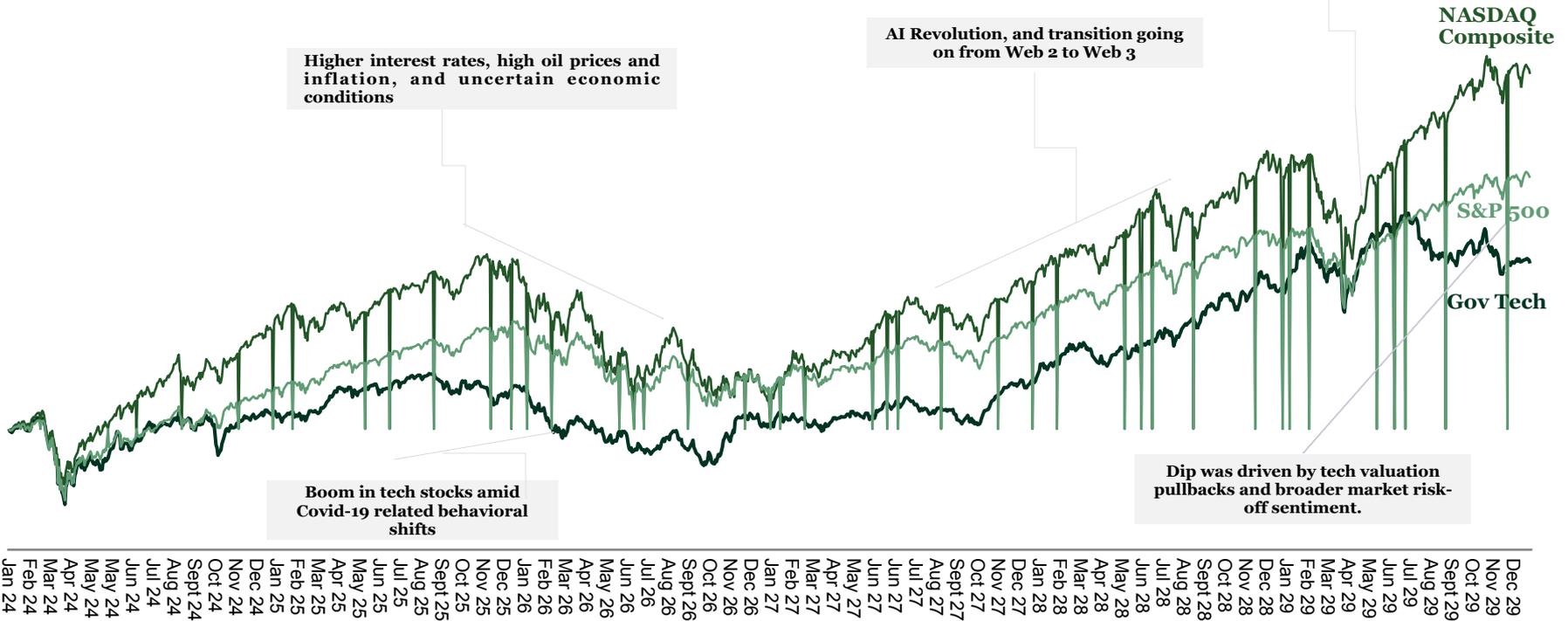


Public Companies Performance (2/3)

The GovTech sector faced pressure in Q4 2025 as broader tech valuations softened and investor sentiment turned more cautious. While federal modernization and AI-driven infrastructure remained long-term tailwinds, year-end profit-taking and multiple compression weighed on performance.

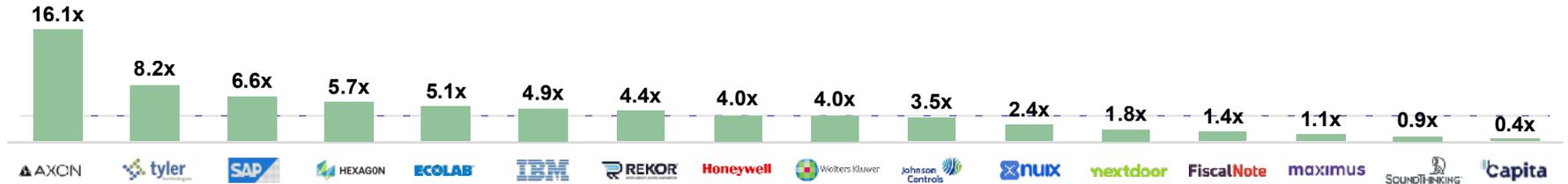
Q2 saw a dramatic rebound after April's tariff-driven sell-off.



Public Companies Performance (3/3)

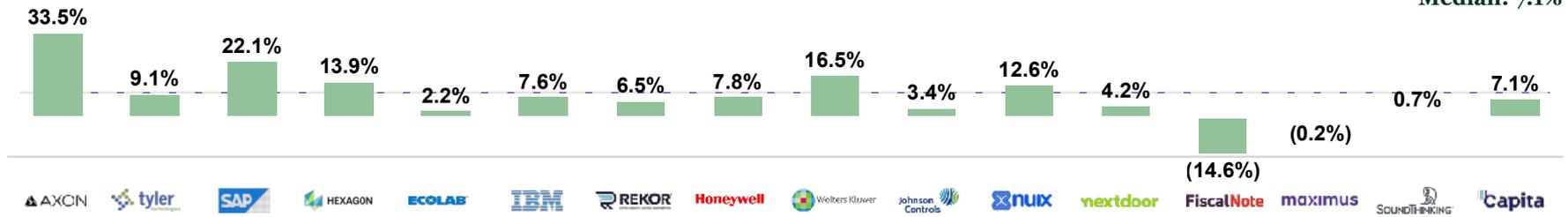
EV/Revenue (LTM)

Median: 4.0x



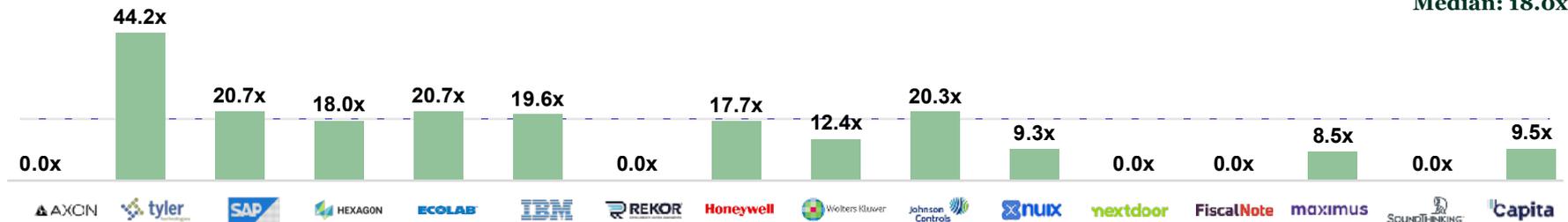
Revenue Growth (LTM)

Median: 18.0x



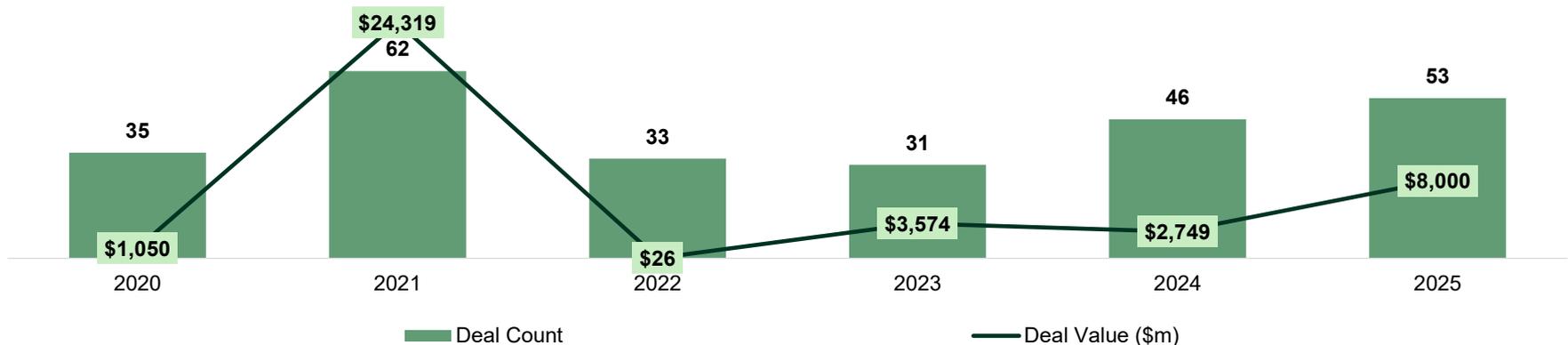
Government Technology M&A Activity (1/4)

GovTech M&A activity accelerated in Q4 2025, closing the year on elevated momentum as the market experienced a recovery in both deal volume and value, exceeding levels observed over the previous three years. The rise was driven by increased strategic sales, active private equity platform investments, and sustained demand across public safety, digital services, and infrastructure modernization, reflecting strong investor confidence in long-term public-sector growth.

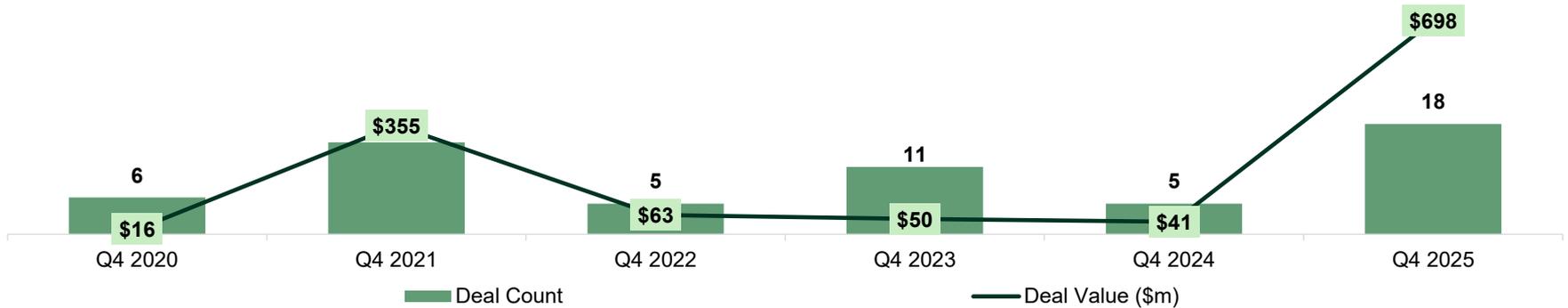

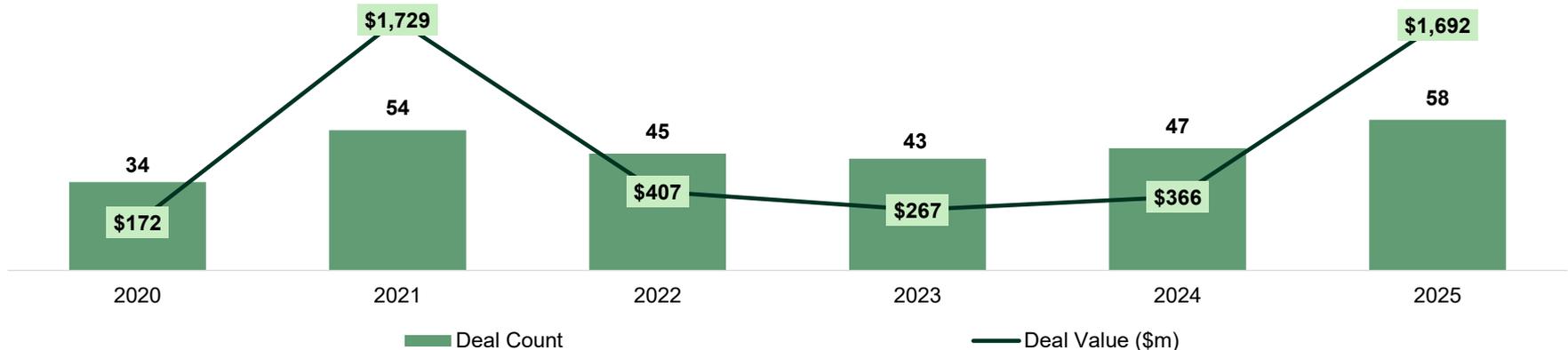
Government Technology Investment Activity (1/5)

GovTech investment activity strengthened in Q4 2025, contributing to a record year for capital deployment across the sector. Increased investor participation and larger growth financings supported elevated funding volumes, driven by continued demand for digital government platforms, public safety technologies, and data-centric solution, reflecting strong investor confidence in long-term public-sector growth.

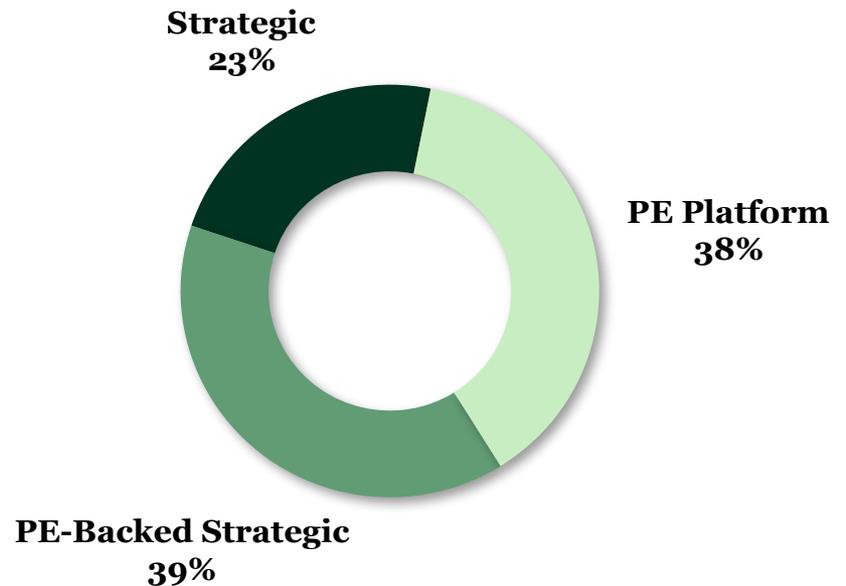
